Service Specification Summary Domiciliary Care (Children 0 – 18 years old)

SCOPE OF SERVICES REQUIRED:

- The Council is seeking to build a sufficient supply of CQC registered care services for children (aged 0 18); in particular:
 - Children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)
 - Children Looked After (CLA)
 - o Children assessed as being a Child in Need (CIN) or at risk of becoming a CIN.
 - The majority of children will have a significant disability and/or mental health needs that impact on their daily lives.
- The care and support services required include:
 - Support with personal care, dressing, getting up and going to bed.
 - Care and support for children with complex care needs (including behaviour that challenges)
 - Continence care and support.
 - Assistance with eating and drinking
 - Assistance with medication
 - Single handed and double handed care
 - O Night-time calls, waking nights, sleep-in care.
 - Sitting services
 - o Support with light meal preparation, and light domestic duties around the home.
- Direct payment users will be eligible to buy care via the DPS at the same hourly rate charged to the Council

CORE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- To be able to apply to join this category of the DPS, Providers will be:
 - o Registered with the Care Quality Commission (CQC) to support children aged 0-18.
 - Rated Good or Outstanding (by CQC) at the time of application; and not be subject to any safeguarding, regulatory or enforcement action.
 - Located in one of the eight local authority areas that constitute Northwest London i.e. Ealing, Brent,
 Harrow, Hillingdon, Hounslow, Hammersmith & Fulham, Kensington, and Westminster (CQC registered locations that are outside Northwest London will not be eligible to apply to join the DPS)
 - o Pay their carers (as a minimum) in line with the RLW (London) rate.
 - o In the main, have Electronic Call Monitoring (ECM) systems in place.

GEOGRAPHY:

- The Council requires services to be provided via the 7-towns that make up the borough i.e. Acton, Ealing, Greenford, Hanwell, Northolt, Perivale, and Southall
- Providers can opt to provide services in one or more of the 7-towns at the application stage.

CALL TIMES:

- Services will be available 7-days per week / 365 days per year
- Daytime services will be available between 07:00 22:00
- Where required, night-time services will be provided between 22:00 08:00
- Ealing Council commissions calls on a 30-min, 45-min, and 60-min basis; increasing by increments of 15-mins.

WORKFORCE:

- Providers applying to join the DPS will ensure:
 - o Services are delivered using strength based and person-centred practice.
 - o Registered Managers are experienced and suitably qualified to ensure services are well-led.
 - Carers are trained and competent to meet all necessary standards and to provide high-quality care
 - As a minimum, carers will have achieved (or be in the process of achieving) the Care Certificate
 - All members of the workforce will be trained in safe care practices and aware of their safeguarding responsibilities.
